





6	Summary	Like any change in life, the industrial revolution also had negative effects. The conditions in which people worked in the factories were very bad- poor ventilation, dirty, damp and poorly lighted. These factories were unhealthy and dangerous places in which to work. Normally, workers put in twelve to fourteen hours daily. The factory system changed the manner in which work was performed earlier. Unlike the domestic system the work was away from home. Workers were viewed by their employers merely as “hands.”


