

Basis of Core values of Indian Democracy

Democracy originated more than 2,400 years ago in ancient Greece. The word "democracy" is derived from the Greek word "demos" which means 'people' and 'cratia' meaning-'government'. Hence, it means "rule by the people." Defining it, thus democracy is a government of the people, by the people and for the people as stated by—Abraham Lincoln.
